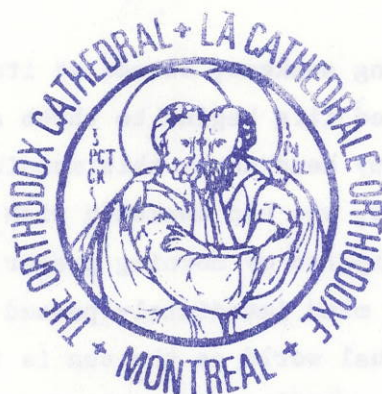

CHRIST IS RISEN!

But now is Christ risen from the dead,
and become the first of them that slept
(I Cor.XV:20)

The sun rises, and everything awakens, stands on its feet, comes to life after the night's torpitude; diversified life begins to throb anew in the land beneath the sun. This thought came into my head early this morning when I awoke from the cheerful chirping of the sparrows, who had awakened with the rising of the sun, and with their simple song anticipated my morning prayer to the Creator, Provider, and Savior. From this thought my mind immediately passed to Christ the Savior Who is the same in the unseen spiritual world as the sun is in the sensible, visible world. When Christ, the Sun of righteousness, comes down to the faithful, loving, penitent soul of the Christian, the soul forthwith comes to life, is illuminated, rejoices, so that the very body becomes vigilant and healthy from the enlivened and awakened soul. But this is unseen; unseen the spiritual Sun rises in the soul, unseen It acts, unseen It also descends, leaving the person again in darkness and sinful torpitude.

And behold the hour will come, on us will rise and be visible our righteous Sun - Christ God, when there comes the second, terrible coming of the Son of God; then all the dead will come to life at His voice and will stand aright in an instant. The hour will come, in which all those in the graves will hear the voice of the Son of God, and having heard, will come to life, and those who did good will come forth to the resurrection of life, but those who did evil to the resurrection of judgment (John V:25,28,29). A miraculous stunning revelation of the power of God: the body, after decaying in the earth, being burnt by fire, drowned in water, consumed by land or sea animals, the body which has become dust, will arise in a new, incorruptible form, joined now for endless ages with its soul, either for eternal joy and beatitude or for eternal woe and suffering. The resurrection of the dead will inexorably occur, just as the sun inexorably rises upon the earth and those born of the earth, just as inexorably spring comes after winter, and after spring, the fruitful summer, just as surely as Christ arose from the dead. But Christ arose from the dead, the Firstborn of the dead, says the Apostle. "I am the first and the last; I am He that liveth and was dead; and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen: and have the keys of hell and of death"(Rev.I:17-18), says He Who Himself arose and ascended into heaven and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father. If the Firstborn of the dead, the God-man Jesus, Who died in

Dearly beloved:

Christ is Risen! On this glorious and triumphant Feast, we greet you with all joy, hope, and love, and embrace you in the joy of the resurrection of Christ.

The death and resurrection of Christ are the core of the Good News, for, as the Apostle Paul writes, "if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor. 15:13). For almost two thousand years the Church has kept the memory of the death and resurrection of Christ. The remembrance of these saving events has always led to the renewal of the Church and to her triumph over all suffering and difficulties.

In the Church's experience, to "remember" something is to be joined to it, to become a part of it. In a real sense the whole of Orthodox Christianity is a ceaseless remembrance of Christ's death and resurrection. Christ is risen, and through Him our own resurrection has already begun. Its light and power already shine in the hearts and lives of those who truly love the Lord, who have not forgotten the ways and the words of the Lord Jesus.

On this glorious Feast through which remembrance is transformed into celebration and participation, let us remember and bring to the presence of the Risen Savior all those who are physically and spiritually homeless, hungry, and naked; who are in prisons of all kinds, in exile and hard labor; whose strength is spent in the search for meaning and salvation.

Let us remember the whole world--this world that lies in sin and darkness and which Christ nonetheless so loved that He gave His life for it. More and more the world is forgetting Christ, His death and resurrection, and is thus sinking into spiritual and intellectual blindness, immorality, and apostasy. It is all the more true that through our remembrance of Christ's resurrection and our celebration of it, the light of Christ will illumine all.

Let us remember, finally, each other and our friends and loved ones, and all those who have died in Christ, so that none may be forgotten in Christ's resurrection.

We humbly and prayerfully remember you, beloved flock of Christ. May the presence of the Risen Lord strengthen you in hope, in love, and in truth, enabling you to be Christ's faithful witnesses.

order to conquer death and grant resurrection to the mortal human race, arose then of course, all will arise; if there is the beginning of resurrection, Christ, then there will occur, without doubt, also the resurrection common for all men. By His eternal life as a man, following His death and resurrection, the Lord assures us of eternal life which will begin for us also after the general resurrection. "I, He says, am He that liveth and was dead: and, behold. I am alive forevermore." And to those words he adds sweet consolation in the words: "I have the keys of hell and of death," i.e. as if to say: Do not be afraid; the keys of hell and of death are with Me now, your Savior, your brother in humanity, Who redeemed you from your sins and from condemnation to hell; no one will lock you there if I do not lock you. I am the Conqueror of hell and death. "All power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth" (Matt. XXVIII:18). O divine, O dear, O sweetest voice of Thine, over-filled with love and sympathy for the mortal race, our immortal Savior! We thank Thee for Thy comforting words. Do not lock us in hell, we who are deserving of imprisonment there for eternity because of our sins. Have compassion, forgive, cleanse our sins, and teach us to live according to Thy holy commandments, teach us Thy statutes. Amen.

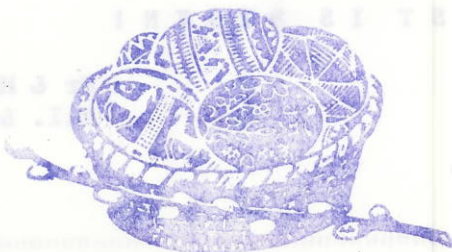

CHRONICLE OF PARISH LIFE
at the Cathedral of
the Holy Apostles Peter & Paul
in the city of Montreal

The Father John of Kronstadt Benefit Society, in keeping with previous years, hold its Easter Collection at the same time that the parish collection is held. With this "Parish News" you will have received an Easter donation request from the Parish Council. Please put your offering in the enclosed envelope and either leave it at the candle desk or mail it to our parish. One third of the money so collected will go to our Benefit Society. Thank you in advance to all who respond to this paschal appeal and who, by their contribution, help the needy and unfortunate. By the time the Feast of the Holy Resurrection comes, our Charity Fund will have sent Easter donations to those in Brazil, Argentina, Peru, Yugoslavia, Austria, Poland; to needy families in the U.S.S.R.; the Holy Land, to Mount Athos; Russian Organizations - the Russian Children's Welfare Society in New York, to Russian Invalids, Holy Protection Monastery in France, the Theological Institute in Paris (France), St. Vladimir's Seminary in New York. The total amount of aid sent - \$ 5,200.00 dollars U.S. Please help us to keep on showing this support, for, we must not forget.

On Easter night, after the Liturgy, the Benefit Society will serve a paschal breakfast for all.

Donations: V.B. Tarassoff made a donations to the memory of her departed sister - Julia as well.

In its "Parish News" (russian version) fund has sent a brochure "The image of Pushkin" to our readers in commemoration of the 150th anniversary since the demise of our beloved poet.

Please try to make a point of purchasing our Charity Fund's greeting cards. This helps us to continue rendering assistance to the needy.

The Annual General Parish Meeting which took place on March 22nd, this year, under the chairmanship of His Eminence, Archbishop Sylvester, with vice-president

N.N. Westphall and secretary H. Lebedeff.

In his address, the Archbishop relayed various facts and figures about the year's Divine Services, Christenings, Marriages and Funerals. During the past year 19 parishioners passed away, among them active, participatory members of our parish. The Archbishop asked the Assembly to sing "Memory Eternal" in remembrance of those who died. In concluding his remarks, Archbishop Sylvester expressed his gratitude to: the clergy, the Sisterhood, the Choir & its Choirmaster, our psalm-reader Mr A.I. Chomicz for his devotion to the kliros, to his helpers, the librarian Z.V. Szpakowska, to G.I. Vinogradov for his having managed this year's lottery, to Church Committee Secretary M.I. Vinogradov, to Church Warden A.A. Kaminski, and the Church Committee, for their assiduous and steadfast concern for the welfare of the Cathedral and parish; he also thanked the Auditing Committee hepped by Mr P.A. Tarasoff.

The Church Warden A.A. Kaminski noted that regardless of declining parish membership, the 1986 financial year was successful due to their support. Numerous repairs on the property were done this past year, namely: roof repairs, installation of alarm system, renovation of the sacristy; the lawn behind the church was re-landscaped, the front walk and driveway were re-paved & hot water facilities were extended to the sacristy and washrooms. After his report, the Church Warden thanked the clergy for their providing parishioners with spiritual support & sustenance. He expressed gratitude to Father Anthony and Protodeacon Gregory Maksymiuk for their voluntary service to the church. He thanked the Vinogradov brothers and I.A. Feochari as the keepers of the church treasury, Mrs M.K. Feochari for organizing "blini-supper" evening, Mr Peter Ferst for travelling on church concerns at his own expense, the Sisterhood headed by Mrs Z.V. Melnyk, Mr V. Hulet for service at the candle counter on weekdays, the Choir, the Brotherhood headed by Mr P.I. Kamel, librarian Mrs Z.V. Szpakowska, Mr A. Cooper and all parishioners for their generous support of the Cathedral.

Church Committee Secretary M.I. Vinogradov reported that 11 scheduled Committee meetings were held in the past year, with one additional un-scheduled meeting. All proceedings were held in a congenial atmosphere, which was useful in bringing the various issues to resolution.

The financial Secretary Mrs V.A. Kaminski read the financial report for 1986 aloud. The annual report for the Building Fund was given by Archbishop Sylvester.

The chairman of the Auditing Committee Mr P.A. Tarasoff announced that the Auditing Committee had examined the parish books and found everything in

order, all items corresponding with the vouchers. In the name of the Auditing Committee, Mr P.A.Tarassoff, proposed that the Assembly express its grateful acknowledgement to Mrs V.A.Kaminski for her efforts.

Church Warden A.A.Kaminski read the Budget for 1987. This budget is projected for \$ 72,077 dollars. Following this were read the financial reports of the Sisterhood, the Library, the Benefit Society and the Cemetery in Rawdon. All the reports were printed in Russian and English and before the commencement of the Parish Meeting were distributed among those attending the meeting who, unfortunately, were few in number - only 64 actual members of the parish were present. Following the presentation of all the financial reports, a short intermission was called during which Mr G.I.Vinogradov appealed to the parishioners for donations to the Building Fund. 3,575.00 dollars were collected and then Mr A.A.Kaminski and Mr P.A.Ferst went on to describe the All-American Church Council, an event held last year in Washington. They spoke of the Council's organization & about the principle themes discussed. Enormous attendance by the youth shows that Orthodoxy in America is growing strong. They also noted that His Beatitude Metropolitan Theodosius will be in our Cathedral on the last Sunday in October - to commemorate the tenth year since his election.

After all the reports, the meeting proceeded to the election of persons to responsible positions. The entire Church Committee was re-elected, but for Mr D.N. Apouchtine, in whose stead, Mr D.A.Poutiatine was elected. The Auditing Committee was also re-elected, with newly elected member Mrs O.A.Melikoff.

After the election to responsible positions, election of delegate to the Canadian Diocesan Congress which is being held in Edmonton (Alberta) - 11th - 13th June, was held the delegate elected for our parish were - Mr A.A.Kaminski.

In closing the General Parish Meeting, Archbishop Sylvester expressed his deep gratitude to all those who attended the General meeting and did some work together for the good of our Cathedral and parish.

The Brotherhood - on Thomas Sunday, April 26th, after the Divine Liturgy the departed members of our Brotherhood will be commemorated after which a memorial dinner be served in the parish hall. The Brotherhood cordially invites everyone to attend this memorial service and meal.

The Blessing of Kulichi and Paschi will take place in the Cathedral on Holy Saturday from 6 to 9 o'clock in the evening. In addition, following the Easter-night Liturgy, there will be a general blessing of kulichi and paschi in the parish hall.

Please Note. This year Paschal Vespers (April 19th) are scheduled for 12 o'clock noon.

Summer Timetable for Divine Services. Everyone please note that after the Feast of the Holy Trinity the Divine Liturgy at our Cathedral will begin at 10 o'clock in the morning.

July 12th - Sunday - The Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul - our patronal feast. The Sisterhood invites all worshippers to a festal meal following the Divine Liturgy.

RAWDON

Regular summer services will begin from May 30th. Saturday Vespers will be at 6:30 p.m., Liturgies on Sundays at 10:30 a.m. Divine Liturgies will also be celebrated on the feast days of the Transfiguration and the Dormition of the Mother of God.

On Sunday, June 14th, following the Liturgy, a general panikhida will be celebrated after which litanies for the departed will be celebrated at the individual graves.

The patronal feast of St. Seraphim of Sarov this year falls on Saturday, August 1st. The official celebration of the patronal feast will be postponed to Sunday, August 2nd. Saturday, after Vespers, the Akathist to St. Seraphim will be held in front of his Holy Relic. On Sunday - Liturgy and molieben will be held. After Liturgy, a festal meal for everyone will also take place.

This year, on September 6th, following the Liturgy, a Panikhida will be celebrated at the MEMORIAL CROSS MONUMENT in memory of all who were killed and tortured.

Every year the St. Seraphim Church Committee organizes a lottery. Tickets for this lottery may be obtained after Easter, either from Church Committee members, or from Mrs L.L. Getopan in Montréal. Please help support this small community undertaking.

The General Parish Meeting of the St. Seraphim community in Rawdon will take place on Sunday, September 6th.

The meeting of the Cemetery Committee will be held on August 30th, following the Divine Liturgy, at the residence of Archbishop Sylvester in Rawdon.

A P P E A L

In the fall of last year at the General Meeting in Rawdon the question as to enlargement of Vladykas house was raised: the addition of a room which would be a library, as well as being able receive those people who arrive for the Liturgy or the Cemetery. During the winter, Mr Peter A.Ostrowski was busy with this proposal. Mr Anthony P.Ostrowski has drawn up the necessary architectural plans and costs. The project was approved by the St.Peter & St.Paul Church Committee and the Rawdon Majory has issued the permit for this. Work will begin this May...

The main preoccupation now remains to obtain the means to cover the costs, which will be between 15 to 20.000 dollars. Some of the costs will be furnished by the Cathedral's Building Fund, according to the Church Committee, one donator has put forth a considerable sum. Because these costs are large, Archbishop Sylvester together with the Church Committee of the St.Seraphim community appeal to all to help build this new construction. Checks may be made out to CHARITY FUND - new construction - which will be income tax deductible. Please help out in this matter!

THE SISTERHOOD extends their heartfelt gratitude to those parishioners and their guests, who presence supported our Dinner-Bazaars (March 1st). We extend as well our sincere gratitude to all the women who so generously volunteered their effort to the Sisterhood. Deep thanks to you all.

On May 3rd - Day of the Holy Myrrh-Bearing Women - following the Divine Liturgy the Sisterhood is hosting a paschal buffet (breakfast). Everyone is welcome!

On June 7th - Holy Pentecost Day - the Sisterhood will provide its final "Sunday Coffee", a service which will resume in September following the summer vacation - September 13th.

The Sisterhood on its own initiative had 10 new icon-stands. All the work was done by Mr I.A.Feochari. Those who took the expenses for the materials upon themselves were:

Mrs Z.Melnyk who, in memory of her husband George, has placed a stand under the icon of St.George the Great Martyr;

Mrs M.Shaborda who, in memory of her husband Stephen, has placed a stand under the icon of the Saviour;

Mr & Mrs S.Lambutsky and Mrs M.Shtym who, in memory of their parents, have placed a stand under the icon of the Mother of our Lord;

Mr I.A.Feochari who, in memory of departed parents & relatives, spoke for the portable stand for the reading of the Gospel;

The womens group who, voluntarily supplied the coffee hour after Liturgy during

the summer season, took the expenses for construction of a large, several icon stand upon themselves;

The remaining 5 stands-icons - have been contributed by the Sisterhood.

Archbishop Sylvester and the Church Committee express deep thanks to Mr I.A. Feofchari for excellent workmanship, and to all those who have striven to decorate the Cathedral with very fine stands for icons.

AID TO BELIEVERS IN RUSSIA
CHARITY FUND

Paris, March 6th 1987.

Your Eminence,

We are sending you an account of our work for the year 1986. We would like to direct your attention to the fact that, apart from forwarding books, clothes and medicine to the U.S.S.R. and giving financial assistance to the needy families of those imprisoned, we are waging a campaign aimed at liberating those imprisoned for following the dictates of their consciences: they are incarcerated in Soviet concentration camps under singularly difficult conditions, as for example was the case of Alexander Ogorodnikov. Last november he began a campaign in his defence, circulating a petition which we sent to Mikhail Gorbachev at the beginning of February this year. Altogether we managed to collect over 135,000 signatures. It must be said that the French press generously supported this information and signature - gathering campaign. At our request we were received at the Soviet Embassy in France. A week after this visit the Soviet Embassy told us that Ogorodnikov was released. Within a few days this announcement was confirmed by the western press agencies. We will soon begin waging a campaign in the press for the defence of Christians found in the camps.

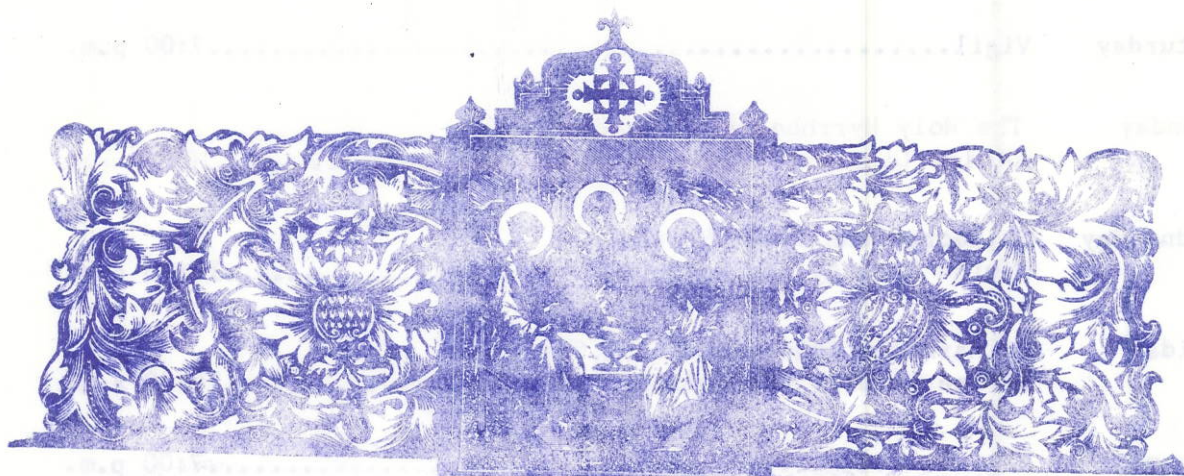
Recently we began a press campaign for the defence of Serge Chodorovitch: the two week old rumour of his release has not yet been confirmed.

We continue with our preparations for the celebration of the millennium of the coming of Christianity to Russia. Specifically, we will publish a book in French, of approximately 350 pages, summing up the history of the persecution of the faithful during the seventy years of communist rule in the U.S.S.R. There will be a major conference on this theme in Paris.

Your help is essential if we are to carry out all of these tasks. We ask you to continue your support of our work again this year. Again we thank you for your assistance to us in our efforts to help the faithful in Russia.

I ask you for your blessing.
